Holly by Stephen King

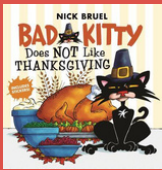

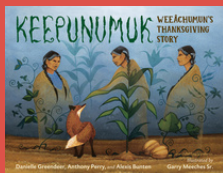
Bad Kitty Does Not Like Thanksgiving by Nick Bruel

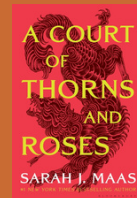

A Court of Thorns and Roses By Sarah J. Mass

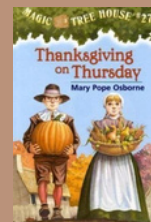
